Victimization of Children & Youth: An International Research Conference sponsored by the University of New Hampshire's Family Research Laboratory (FRL) and Crimes Against Children Research Center (CCRC) as well as the National Institute for Victim Studies at Sam Houston State University.

DETAILS:

This biennial conference on the victimization of children and youth Aug. 4-7 will feature 185 presenters from around the world speaking on a range of issues, including children witnessing domestic violence, childhood loss in war, bullying, and child homicide. In response to the controversy about clergy sexual abuse that has dominated local and national news, Tuesday, Aug. 6, will be devoted to seven speakers on the issue. They will discuss everything from sexual education in seminaries and adult male survivors, to long-term health implications and prevention.
