DURHAM, N.H. -- Award-winning Irish poet Micheal O'Siadhail will share the elegance of his poetry during a reading Wednesday, Nov. 6, 2002. The event, sponsored by the Friends of the Library, will be held at 7 p.m., in the Dimond Library, Level 5 Reading Room.
