## **Retired Army General Discusses Fight Against Terrorism at UNH**

DURHAM, N.H. -- Recently retired U.S. Army General Wesley Clark, who commanded the first successful military action in response to the Kosovo crisis in 1999, will discuss America's role in fighting global terrorism Wednesday, Oct. 9, 2002, from 4:30-6:15 p.m. in the Memorial Union Building's Theater I at the University of New Hampshire.

Sponsored by the UNH Political Science Department, the College of Liberal Arts, and the Center for International Education, the lecture is free and open to the public.

Clark was the Supreme Allied Commander Europe from 1997 to 2000, during which time he commanded Operation Allied Force, NATO's successful military action in Kosovo. This was NATO's first major combat action, and largest air operation in Europe since World War II. He recently authored "Waging Modern War: Bosnia, Kosovo, and the Future of Combat" and serves as a military analyst for CNN.
