DURHAM, N.H. -- John Richardson, professor of international development in the School of International Service at American University, will discuss "From Development Failure to Deadly Conflict in Sri Lanka: Lessons for Politicians and Practitioners" at the University of New Hampshire Wednesday, Nov. 20, 2002, as part of the New Hampshire International Seminar Series.
