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DURHAM, N.H. -- The University of New Hampshire's Institute for the Study of Earth, Oceans and Space will host two one-day workshops for teachers on using student-based inquiry as a means for learning the scientific process July 16 and 17, from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in Morse Hall on the UNH campus.

The non-credit courses are offered by the Complex Systems Research Center and the New Hampshire Space Grant Consortium, and funded with a grant from the state Department of Education.
