An internationally known UNH professor and a generous alumni benefactor recently received the University of New Hampshire's most prestigious awards for their support of and service to the university. During a campus celebration on September 25, John H. "Jack" Smith '50 was presented with the UNH Foundation's Hubbard Family Award for Service to Philanthropy, the university's highest honor to recognize philanthropic leadership and gifts. David Finklehor, professor of sociology and founder and director of the Crimes Against Children Research Center, received the Charles Holmes Pettee Medal, which honors individuals whose life work reflects exceptional service to the

state, nation or world.
