

James Ramsay Receives Charles Culbertson Award

The American Society of Safety Engineers (ASSE) has selected James Ramsay, professor and program coordinator of [homeland security](#), to receive the 2016 Charles V. Culbertson Outstanding Volunteer Service Award.



Ramsay serves as chair of the ASSE education standards committee, and for the past several years has been developing a roadmap to frame the occupational safety and health profession, which includes the development of national standards of education and accreditation.

Ramsay recently completed a four-year term on the board of scientific counselors to the director of the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) — a post to which he was appointed by the U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services. He currently serves on the CDC NIOSH Institutional Review Board.

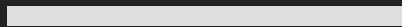
