The ECenter’s goal is to continue building the positive and supportive idea, innovation, and entrepreneurial culture at UNH, for all students, faculty, staff, researchers, and alumni. The ECenter has already established itself as the hub in its area on campus. Programs include a start-up speaker series, three bootcamps centered around networking, marketing, and sales; a hackathon; 1:1 coaching; the \$10,500 summer seed grant; and the paid internship at start-ups program. Physical resources include co-working zones at Alpha Loft and the Caffeinator Coffee Bar, both at the ECenter.

The ECenter in the UNHInnovation wing of Madbury Commons is intentionally independent of any one college on campus. It is for all students, faculty, staff, researchers, and alumni. The ECenter’s goal is to continue building the university’s positive and supportive idea/innovation/entrepreneurial culture. It creates opportunities for engagement through new co-curricular programming, as well as supporting existing academic, student, university, and independent initiatives.

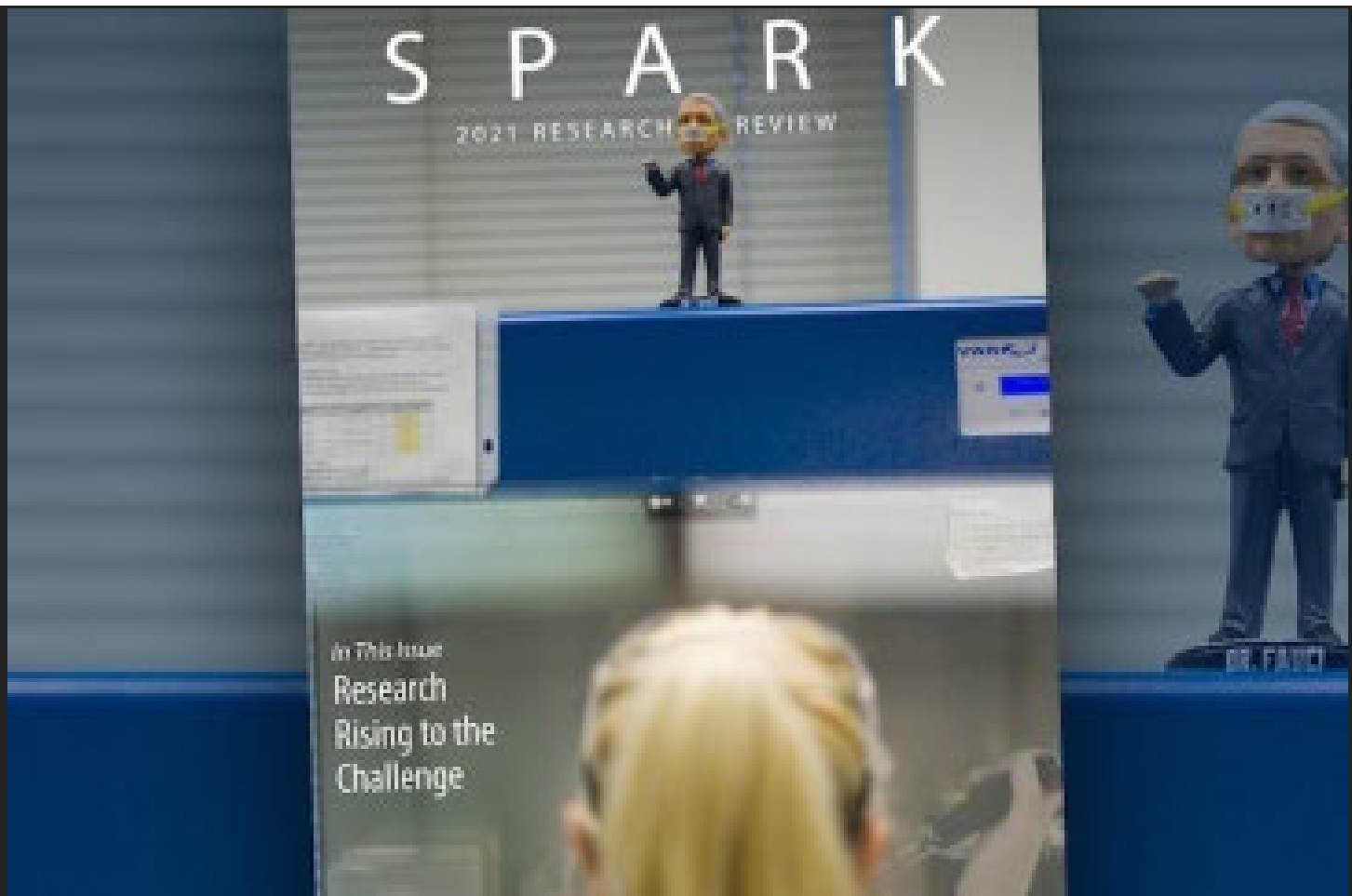
