I am writing with an important update on the National Education Association's campaign to unionize subsets of the university's OS and PAT employees. Friday afternoon, we learned that the union has formally withdrawn its petitions to the Public Employee Labor Relations Board (PELRB) to organize OS and PAT employees.

This is an important outcome because it means there will not be a union election for the OS and PAT groups identified in the petitions filed by the union last December. The Health Services and Counseling Center petition continues to work through the PELRB process. The university will provide updates on this petition as they become available.
