Her doctoral research is a collaborative project with four Tribal Historic Preservation Offices in southern New England, which uses GIS analysis, landscape archaeology, and ethnohistory to contribute to the documentation and protection of indigenous ceremonial landscapes. Alix is also the archaeologist at Strawbery Banke Museum in Portsmouth, NH, where she has directed the annual archaeological field school since 2014. As a postdoc affiliate, Alix will work with Professor Howey to develop an internship program at Strawbery Banke for UNH anthropology students. 
