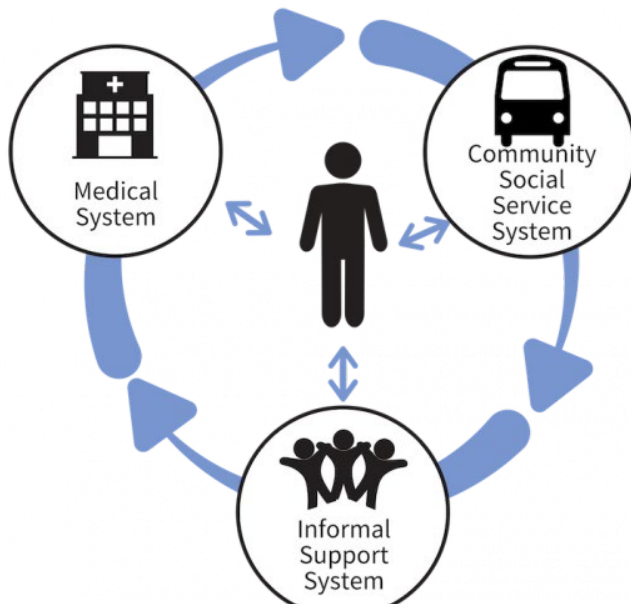


# A new approach to Care Coordination
